- Dave says that the beach looks beautiful, if we all could pick up sticks when we see them and throw them in burn pile to keep the park looking clean.
- Joe Scharnak donated the little picnic tables.

Presidents Report:

John said we created a membership directory by lot. We are still having problems with it but getting close to accurate. Thinking of putting together a membership directory. - Boat Chairperson Jerry is retiring. Jerry nominated Jim Kingsly and Teresa seconded. All approved.

Member Forum:

- Floyd mentioned safety issues. People need to follow the rules with golf carts better.
 Floyd mentioned that other dogs had attacked his dog four separate times. A reminder that you must have a fence if dog is going to be off leash. He mentioned that people need to follow the speed limit. He will tag the car and turn it over to the police department if speeding.
- Rosanne Brynes talked about the Diamond Lake Association. Says it is important for all of us to join. They are the ones that maintain the lake. The dues are \$50.00 a year. They are trying to get all associations together for more power. They help maintain the water quality, keep the geese down, provide firework displays, run the porch parties at the sand bar and bands.
